

BHS LOCAL SCHOLARSHIP 2014-15 DESCRIPTIONS

Altrusa Club Scholarship – Two scholarships are awarded—one must attend SDSU—with criteria based on activities, volunteerism and strong ACT.

Banner and Associates, Inc. Scholarship – Must plan on majoring in Engineering or a related field such as Architecture and attend SDSU.

Bauer Family Friends of Baseball Scholarship – Awarded for playing and being involved with the Brookings Baseball program.

Beatty Family Scholarship -- Demonstrate maturity and responsibility either by extensive volunteerism, part-time employment, or over-coming hardship while in high school. Must attend SDSU or a 2-year program at a SD technical school.

Benfield Family Scholarship – Two scholarships are awarded. One is for a Science or Mathematics major; the other is for a Human Development, Child Development, Psychology, Sociology or Social Work major. Must attend a 4-year, out-of-state school, and show long-standing dedication to a volunteer project.

Bergum Family Scholarship – Chosen by the Bergum family according to their scholarship's criteria.

Best Choice David & Sara Kneip Real Estate Scholarship – Four scholarships are awarded to students who have shown they are academically or altruistically worthy of being recognized for their accomplishments.

BHS Monogram Club Scholarship – Must be a member of the BHS Monogram Club, have shown leadership in a sport or fine arts activity, and have at least a 3.5 GPA.

BHS SADD Scholarship -- Two scholarships are awarded. Must be an active member of BHS SADD. Leadership, volunteerism, and academics are all considered for this scholarship.

BHS Student Council Scholarship – Two scholarships are awarded. Need not be a member of Student Council, but must have at least a 3.5 grade point average, participated in at least 5 school events during 4 years, and have shown leadership qualities in some way.

Bobcat Backers Scholarship – Six scholarships are awarded to those who have participated in two or more interscholastic sports throughout high school; have demonstrated the potential for success in either vocational/technical or higher education; have demonstrated such qualities as persistence, work ethic, and leadership during their participation; whose parent(s) are members of the Bobcat Backers.

Brooke Anderson Joniak Scholarship -- Student must attend a 4-year, out-of-state university or college that does not offer reciprocity or equivalent to in-state tuition; have an ACT of 28 or above and be in the top 10% of graduating class. Applicant must be a member of National Honor Society; is well-rounded and active in high school activities, with preference given to one who is involved in band, vocal music, and/or yearbook staff.

Brookings American Legion Post #74 Scholarship -- Must attend SDSU. Student must show they are academically or altruistically worthy of being recognized for their accomplishments. ACT score must be under 24.

Brookings Education Association Scholarship -- Student must be majoring in education (will be a teacher upon graduation) and have a 3.0 or above GPA. Special consideration will be given to children of BEA members.

Brookings Health System Educational Scholarship – Applicant must be pursuing education in a healthcare career and attend any college or technical institute in South Dakota. Must rank in the top 50% of class; have a minimum GPA of 3.0; and demonstrate involvement in community service. Preference will be given to an applicant who has a parent employed by Brookings Health System.

Brookings High School PTA Scholarship -- Two scholarships are awarded to students who have shown they are academically or altruistically worthy of being recognized for their accomplishments.

Brookings High School Visual Arts Scholarship – Two scholarships are awarded to students who have taken at least 3 semesters of visual art classes as a foundation toward an Art major or minor at any college or technical school.

Brookings Municipal Utilities Scholarship – Two scholarships are awarded. Applicants must attend college or technical school in SD; rank in top ½ of class; demonstrate involvement in school activities and community service.

Brookings Police Foundation Scholarship – This scholarship is awarded to the student whose parent/guardian is Brookings law enforcement officer, or to a student attending SDSU who will major in criminal justice or related field.

Brookings School Administrators Scholarship -- This scholarship is awarded to a student who has shown to be academically or altruistically worthy of being recognized for their accomplishments.

Brookings School District CTE Scholarship – This scholarship is awarded to a student who will be attending a technical/vocational school for any degree, who is worthy of being recognized for their accomplishments.

Brookings School Permanent Fund Scholarship – This scholarship is awarded to a student who has shown to be academically or altruistically worthy of being recognized for their accomplishments.

Buck a Point Bob & Jean Jostad Scholarship – Two scholarships are awarded to students who have shown to be academically or altruistically worthy of being recognized for their accomplishments.

Cabana Banners Randy Nash Memorial Scholarship – The scholarship recipient has been accepted to and will attend SDSU, and has obvious strengths in either school activities, community service and/or work.

Carol Thomas Memorial Scholarship – The scholarship recipient will have positively changed their path while a student within the Brookings School District, and plans to attend college with preference given to students attending Dakota State University and/or will major in Education or the Humanities.

Class of 1950 Scholarship – This scholarship is awarded to a student who will attend a four year college or university, demonstrated community service, and has a GPA of 3.5 or above.

Class of 1956 Scholarship – This scholarship recipient must have a GPA of 3.0 or above and demonstrate financial need.

Class of 1961 Scholarship -- This scholarship is awarded to a student who has shown to be academically or altruistically worthy of being recognized for their accomplishments.

Class of 1966 Scholarship -- This scholarship is awarded to a student who has shown to be academically or altruistically worthy of being recognized for their accomplishments and has a 3.0 or higher GPA.

Class of 1967 Scholarship -- This scholarship is awarded to a student who has shown to be academically or altruistically worthy of being recognized for their accomplishments and is in the upper 2/3 of their class.

Class of 1976 Scholarship -- Preference for the scholarship is given to a child of a graduate of BHS Class of 1976. The student will have shown to be academically or altruistically worthy of being recognized for their accomplishments.

Class of 2007 Ashley and Amanda Loban Memorial Scholarship – This scholarship is awarded to a student with a GPA of 2.5 or higher who has shown good character, positive attitude, and consideration of others.

Cubby's and Shane Andersen of Century 21 Gustafson, Krogman & Associates Super Shot Soccer Scholarship – This scholarship requires 3 years of high school level soccer, with a GPA 3.0 or above, and school and community involvement. Preference is given to a student who will play college soccer.

Daktronics, Inc. Scholarship – The scholarship recipient must have a 3.5 or higher GPA, who will attend SDSU. Student must major in electrical engineering, electronics engineering technology, or computer science and demonstrate volunteerism or community service.

David Hoyt Memorial Scholarship – This scholarship is awarded to an education major and/or a student that has utilized special education services or classes at ALC who will attend a 2 or 4 year post high school.

Doc Serlet Memorial Scholarship – The scholarship recipient must be attending a vocational/technical school for a 2-year degree and have maintained a minimum “C” average.

Dr. Scotty Roberts Memorial Scholarship – This scholarship is awarded to a student who will attend a 4-year college, and who has demonstrated active participation in volunteer projects in the Brookings community and school during all 4 years of high school.

Drew Erickson Memorial Scholarship – The scholarship recipient must be attending a 4-year college or university out-of-state, be in top ¼ of his/her class, and have a strong ACT. Maturity and responsibility must be evidenced by opportunities taken to volunteer in the community.

Eastern Star Scholarship – The criteria for this scholarship includes leadership, initiative, community activities, and financial need for a student attending a 2 or 4-year post-high school.

First Bank and Trust Scholarship – Four scholarships are awarded to students who have shown to be academically or altruistically worthy of being recognized for their accomplishments.

Golden Service Club Scholarship – Two scholarships are awarded. Preference for this scholarship will be given to students who have taken CTE classes during their junior and senior years at BHS, and who will attend either a technical school or university within the state of South Dakota. Must have an ACT of 18 or higher and at least a 2.5 GPA. Consideration is to be given to students who demonstrate active community involvement.

Harms Charters Scholarship – The scholarship recipient must attend either SDSU or Northern State University and has shown to be academically or altruistically worthy of being recognized for their accomplishments.

Helsper & Mahlke, PC Scholarship – Preference for this scholarship goes to students in the Helsper or Mahlke families. Other criteria include leadership, good citizenship and good character; participation in school and extra-curricular activities; attend a South Dakota 4-year university or college; and have a final cumulative GPA of 3.25 or above.

Homer and Marjorie Prunty Scholarship – This scholarship recipient must major in Construction Management, Nursing or Education; have a B average or above; shows community service, school activities and summer employment.

Joanie and Rick Holm Scholarship – The student who receives this scholarship will major in a health care profession and demonstrate volunteerism. Preference will be given to those who show dedication to a service project through years of service and hours of contribution.

Johan Johnson Memorial Scholarship – This scholarship will be awarded to a student who participated and was successful in policy debate.

Kiwanis Club Scholarship -- Preference given to student with parent/grandparent who is an active member of a Kiwanis Club in SD, ND or MN who has shown to be academically or altruistically worthy of being recognized for their accomplishments.

Larson Foundation Scholarship – Four scholarships are awarded. Recipients must be in top one-third of their class and show they are academically or altruistically worthy of being recognized for their accomplishments.

Lillian Wulbers Memorial Medical Scholarship – Six scholarships are awarded. Recipients must major in a medically-related field; show academic promise through GPA and ACT; have Math and Science background; and show leadership in and/or community involvement.

Marlene Heinz-Jones Memorial Nursing Scholarship – This scholarship will be awarded to a student in the top ½ of their class who will attend a four year college and major in Nursing.

Marylin Anne Plant Benfield Memorial Scholarship – The scholarship recipient will attend a 4-year college or university out-of-state and must have quality community service, showing at least a 2-year commitment to one volunteer project.

Masonic Lodge #24 Scholarship – The scholarship recipient must have a parent/grandparent who is/was a Mason, and show they are academically or altruistically worthy of being recognized for their accomplishments.

Mertin A, Karen and George Lund Family Scholarship – This scholarship is awarded to a student attending either a 4-year college or 2-year technical school, who has shown achievement in NFL (National Forensics League) or BHS Golf, and has financial need.

MetaBank Touchdown Countdown Scholarship – Two scholarships are awarded. Recipients must attend a college in SD, and their parent/guardian cannot be an employee of MetaBank. Other criteria include activities and community service involvement.

Mills Construction Building Leaders Scholarship – This scholarship is awarded to a student who has taken Residential Construction; has a 3.2 GPA or above; and is involved in extracurricular school activities and demonstrates leadership. Preference given to those intending to major in Construction Management and Building Trades; Mechanical Engineering, Civil Engineering or Architecture at SDSU or a MN or SD technical school will also be considered.

Noon Lions Club Scholarship – The scholarship recipient must attend a post-high school in SD, and show they are academically or altruistically worthy of being recognized for their accomplishments.

Optimist Club Scholarship – Six scholarships are awarded. Preference is given to students whose parents are members of the Optimists, and show they are academically or altruistically worthy of being recognized for their accomplishments.

Patricia Lou Horrigan Memorial Scholarship – The scholarship is awarded to a student with a grade point average of 3.0 or above who will preferably major in education, and has demonstrated financial need.

PEO Chapter CA Women's Scholarship – This scholarship is for a female recipient who has shown they are academically or altruistically worthy of being recognized for their accomplishments.

PEO Chapter CR Scholarship -- This scholarship is for a female recipient who has shown they are academically or altruistically worthy of being recognized for their accomplishments.

Peter L. Hays Memorial Scholarship – This scholarship is awarded to a student who is a member of the BHS boys or girls golf team, with a 3.0 or above GPA, with community service and school activities. Preference will be given to a student attending college in a business related major.

Prest Family Scholarship – The scholarship recipient must be attending a 4-year post-high school and has shown they are academically or altruistically worthy of being recognized for their accomplishments.

Rosemary Hauschild Memorial Scholarship – This scholarship is awarded to a student planning to major in education, has shown good character and participated in extra-curricular activities, especially dance.

Rotary Club Scholarship – Three scholarships are awarded. Recipients must be attending SDSU, have excellent records of community service, show a capacity for leadership, and have a 21 or higher ACT.

SD Bankers Foundation BankStar Financial Scholarship – The recipient must be attending a 2 or 4-year school in SD and has shown they are academically or altruistically worthy of being recognized for their accomplishments.

SD Bankers Foundation MetaBank Scholarship – This scholarship is awarded to a student who will attend an in-state school, and currently has a part-time job while showing academic promise and participating in extra-curricular, religious, or volunteer activities.

Sherman Dairy Scholarship – The recipient of this scholarship must be an employee or have a parent/guardian who is an employee of Sherman Dairy LLP of Estelline, have a 3.0 or higher GPA, and at least 20 hours of community service.

Smart Start Achievement Scholarship – The recipient of this scholarship will have attended the Smart Start Center.

Thaddeus A. and Eva R. Selix Scholarship – This scholarship will be awarded to a student who has shown they are academically or altruistically worthy of being recognized for their accomplishments.

Total Eyewear Open Door Scholarship – The scholarship recipient will have shown they have overcome challenges that are more than the average high school student may encounter and has persevered.

Virgil A. and Eileen F. Bell Scholarship – This scholarship is awarded to student in the top 1/3 of their class who will attend a 4-year college/university and major in Education and/or Science, and have demonstrated financial need.

Wayne D. Ellingson Family Scholarship – The scholarship recipient will be named by the math instructors at BHS, should have a high ACT or SAT math score, and must demonstrate a strong appreciation for and desire to learn mathematics and exhibit their fondness of the subject by willingly helping in the classroom or tutoring outside the school setting.
